UNSC

Agenda – “The Situation in the Sahel Region: Addressing Armed Secessionist Movements and Threats to International Peace and Security”

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) is one of the most powerful bodies within the UN, responsible for maintaining international peace and security. With 15 member states – including five permanent ones with veto power – it's where major decisions are made on sanctions, peacekeeping missions, and global crises. It's not just a room for debate; it's a space where diplomacy meets action, and where words can translate into real consequences on the ground.

The Situation in the Sahel Region brings us face-to-face with one of the most complex and urgent challenges in the world today. The Sahel isn't just dealing with conflict, it's a region where violent extremism, weak governance, climate pressures, and secessionist ambitions are all colliding without any interventions towards peace. Armed groups are gaining ground, national borders are being tested, and millions of lives are being disrupted. As delegates, you'll need to think carefully about how to balance national sovereignty with the international responsibility to protect, how to support governments without enabling repression, and how to promote peace without silencing legitimate voices. This is your chance to tackle real-world questions with real-world impact. and hopefully, to build solutions that move beyond words on paper.

UNHRC

Agenda - "Digital Surveillance and Privacy Violations; Protecting Human Rights in the Age of Technology"

The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) is a body within the United Nations responsible for promoting and protecting human rights globally. It serves as a platform for member states to discuss human rights violations, create policies, and recommend measures to address issues impacting dignity, freedom, and equality. UNHRC's work often includes conducting investigations into violations, establishing special rapporteurs, and supporting humanitarian efforts in crisis regions.

In the age of technological advancements, digital surveillance has emerged as a double-edged sword. While it is often employed to ensure security, combat crime, and monitor threats, it also risks infringing upon the fundamental rights to privacy, freedom of expression, and even freedom of association. With increasing concerns about mass surveillance programs, misuse of personal data, and the potential for authoritarian regimes to suppress dissent through technological means, this agenda calls for urgent discourse.

ECOSOC

Agenda: “Global Shift in Reserve Currency Dynamics: Implications for Trade, Tariffs, and Development Finance”

This committee, the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), established in 1945 by the UN Charter, is one of the UN’s six principal organs. It addresses global economic and social challenges by shaping policy, promoting sustainable development, and encouraging international cooperation.

Today, the global financial system is shifting, with BRICS nations and emerging economies pushing for de-dollarization and alternative currencies. This movement, driven by geopolitical tensions, sanctions, and the rise of central bank digital currencies (CBDCs), challenges the U.S. dollar’s long-standing dominance.

A multipolar currency system can enhance national sovereignty through local currency trade, reduced exchange rate risks, and more leverage in trade negotiations. However, it also brings risks—fragmented pricing, reduced liquidity, and financial instability. In development finance, diversified reserve currencies could expand funding access for emerging economies, but require stronger financial infrastructure and risk management.

This committee calls for a focused, forward-thinking dialogue on reshaping global finance. By promoting resilience, inclusion, and cooperation, ECOSOC urges member states to help build a fair and stable financial system for a multipolar world.

AIPPM

Agenda: “Freedom of Press and Role of Media in Indian Democracy”

The All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM) is a dynamic Model UN committee that simulates political discourse among India's national and regional parties. It reflects real-world political ideologies, encouraging delegates to debate, negotiate, and build coalitions while upholding their party's stance. AIPPM emphasizes the complex interplay of politics, policy, and governance within India's democratic framework.

This session's agenda focuses on press freedom in India and the media's role as a watchdog, agenda-setter, and platform for public discourse. With rising concerns over media trials, fake news, censorship, corporate influence, and eroding journalistic independence, delegates will evaluate the current media landscape. Key points include constitutional protections under Article 19(1)(a), the Press Council Act, and the impact of digital media.

The committee will explore reforms such as regulating paid news, protecting whistleblowers and journalists, and strengthening independent media bodies. The goal is to find a balance between freedom of expression and responsible journalism, ultimately redefining the media's role in upholding transparency, accountability, and democratic integrity in India.



Agenda: “Combating Corruption and Doping in International Sports”

Welcome to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) forum, where sports transcend boundaries to unite the world. Founded in 1894, the IOC is the guardian of the Olympic Games, promoting Olympism and the values of friendship, solidarity, and fair play. As the governing body, it oversees the organization of the Games and ensures the principles of excellence, respect, and inclusion are upheld. Today, we come together to shape the future of this global institution and its role in inspiring unity through sport.

The IOC is responsible for regulating all aspects of the Olympics—from selecting host cities to determining athlete eligibility. Its mandate includes ensuring the smooth running of the Games and advancing the Olympic movement. However, concerns have emerged about unethical practices, including bribery by influential athletes to secure participation. In a time where ethics are often compromised, this agenda calls for reflection on the future of the Games.

The committee will address two major threats to international sport: corruption and doping. Corruption affects bidding, athlete selection, and officiating, while doping threatens fairness and athlete health. The IOC aims to strengthen anti-corruption measures, promote transparency, and enhance global cooperation to protect the integrity of sport.
